
Welcome to the West Covina Hills SDA Church Family!

The Gift of Mercy, Undeserved

He doesn't know it, but one of the things I respect most about my husband is that he is merciful. In fact, it's one of the very first things I ever learned to respect about him.

Within the first couple of months of our dating relationship, my patient husband (then new boyfriend) lent me a piece of rope. I was a resident assistant at our college, and one of the events I participated in even before school began was an RA dedication and vespers service on a Friday evening. Our deans instructed us to bring an object that represented what we wanted to accomplish, or how we wanted to be seen by those who would be under our leadership throughout the coming year. I told John the assignment, and we tossed around some ideas. I don't remember who came up with the rope idea, or even what I used it to represent. Whatever its original intended function, it has come to mean something far more lasting to me because somehow, in the course of the evening, the rope got lost.

Under normal circumstances, it wouldn't matter what happened to a two-foot piece of rope, but this one was special. John had earned it in Pathfinders when he did his knot-tying honor (an honor he is still proud to have acquired). He respected the person who gave it to him. It was a unique type of quality rope not available at your local hardware store. When he lent it to me, and he even taught me one of his clever knot-tying tricks, which we practiced together. He never said, "I better get this rope back," but I knew he was entrusting me with something valuable. It never occurred to me not to treat it with care and ensure its safe return. Yet somehow, when I was ready to leave vespers, the rope had disappeared. I looked everywhere, but it was gone.

It took me several days to work up the courage to tell him, and I still remember the walk we took that evening. I really didn't know how he'd react; I just knew I felt terrible. He was disappointed, understandably. But he never raised his voice, never said anything remotely hurtful to me or regretful in lending me his prized possession. He held my hand anyway, and forgave me. I still feel sad that the rope is gone forever, but it's a memory I still treasure.
